### **Inspiration Point**

This article is borrowed from a course, "Six Disciplines of Prayer" by Richard W. LaFountain.

"Are you known at the throne?" Over in the Book of Acts, the 19th chapter, Paul was preaching in Ephesus and God was doing great wonders among these spiritual people. Two Jews took it upon themselves to cast out demons like Paul, using the name of Jesus as their magic words. It didn't work. Jesus' name is not a magic word. It represents a relationship. Without the relationship, there is no power in using His name. So, the demons jumped all over these clever guys. But before doing so, the demons left us with a clear spiritual insight. They said, "Jesus we know, and Paul we know, but who are you?"

You see, Jesus was known in heavenly places because of who He is. Even the demons knew Him in His ministry as the Son of David who came to destroy them. He, Jesus, was mighty in prayer. Paul was a follower of Jesus, but he also developed intimacy with God in his closet of prayer, so that he was a familiar face before the throne of God and evidently a terrifying spectacle to demons as well. Paul was known at the throne! Paul was known in spiritual realms as a friend of God, and therefore a force to be reckoned with. God fought for him. Are you known at the throne?

Jesus calls us to develop an intimate relationship with Him and the Father by becoming frequent visitors before the throne. This is why Paul could say in **Hebrews 4:12**, **"Therefore**, (since we are intimate with the Son of God) **let us come boldly to the throne of Grace to find mercy and grace in help in the time of need."** The secret was not some pretended, forced, or ad-libbed boldness of "name it and claim it" before the throne, but a natural result of intimacy with God developed over long hours, days, months, and years of being a regular worshiper at God's throne.

Worship comes before wishing, wanting, or begging. We are not beggars before the throne. We are sons. Sons who only know their father as Santa Claus are not sons. True sons revel in the relationship with their loving Father. The "stuff" is what they get as an overflow from the relationship, not a manipulation of it. Prayer is not asking. Prayer is living in the presence of God. Prayer is loving God and letting ourselves be loved by Him. We must learn that prayer is a love relationship. If it is anything else it is no different than the prayers of all other religions – it becomes merely an attempt to manipulate God for our own benefit. Only when we see prayer as a relationship can we understand the exhortation, **"Pray without ceasing."** (I Thessalonians 5:17 KJV)

Six Steps to Intimacy With God:

- 1. Be Still (still your busy mind and cluttered heart)
- 2. Be Thankful (new mercies, your body, all creation, Blessings and benefits)
- 3. Be Worshipful (love songs sung to God, long after Him, lift His glory, love His worth, list His names, lively worship)
- 4. Confess Sins (your words, your attitudes, your thoughts, your actions)
- 5. Clothe Yourself (apply God's forgiveness, recon who you are in Christ, raise the shield of faith against Satan, embrace a promise of God for this day)
- 6. Cast your Care (family, finances, frustrations, fears, worries, failures)

To develop a deep relationship requires that you spend a lot of time in God's presence! A quick prayer sent up in the middle of a busy day may be good for an emergency but that does not build the intimacy we all seek to have! Ask God to let the Holy Spirit guide you in developing that relationship! Then be still and listen to your heart as He guides you!

#### MAKING THE PARROT TALK (REVELATION 2:5-6)



A woman bought a parrot to keep her company. She returned to the pet store the next day with a complaint: "This bird you sold me won't talk." The pet store manager said, "Does he have a mirror in his cage? Parrots love mirrors. They see their reflection and they start up a conversation." So, she bought a mirror and went home.

A couple of days later she was back. The bird still wasn't talking. "How about a ladder?" the manager asked. "A ladder will make your parrot happy, and a happy parrot is more likely to talk." She bought the ladder and left.

Two days later she returned. The bird still hadn't said anything. The store manager thought for a minute and said, "How about a swing? All parrots need a swing. A swing will loosen him up, and he'll be talking in no time." The woman reluctantly bought the swing and left.

She was back the next day, looking forlorn. "My parrot died," she said. "That's terrible," the manager said. "Did he ever say a word?" "Yes," the woman said, "Right before he died, he said, 'Don't they sell any food at that pet store?"

#### TRYING ONE THING AND THEN ANOTHER

Isn't this just like us? We try so hard to get the things we want in so many ways, and we keep overlooking the simplest, most obvious solutions. I see it in people who seek with all their heart to be happy, going from one distraction to the next -- possessions and relationships most often -- and yet their hunger is never satisfied.

I also see it in the United Methodist Church and in individual churches working feverishly to catch the next fad, trying desperately to be "relevant", yet continually overlooking their most basic objective: <u>bringing people to</u> <u>Christ and teaching them to become disciples</u>.

Are you starving? Is your house filled with things and your life filled with activities and your ministry filled with programs -- and are you still starving?

#### TIME TO RETURN

At the risk of losing you with this series of clichés, it's time to return to square one, get back to basics and put first things first. These words may sound trite, but they work. The parrot died because his owner overlooked what really matters -- and many of our troubles can be traced to the same.

Jesus said to the church in Ephesus, "You have forsaken your first love. Remember the height from which you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first." (Revelation 2:5-6) He also told his followers to "seek first his [God's] kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matthew 6:33)

If you're floundering, I encourage you to find your way back to square one, and never lose sight of it again. We don't just begin with the basics; we win with the basics. They are our strategy for "success" -- the key to accomplishing God's will with our lives and furthering his kingdom with our work.

But, one of the coolest things is that you learn new recipes and new ways to put together amazing meals! As many of you know, Scott and I moved to Waxhaw a little over a year ago. We rented in a townhome community for a year, where we very quickly made fast friends with our neighbors on either side. We enjoyed front porch visits with Barbara and Sherry and Sherry's husband D. We swapped family stories. We gifted each other with dishes that we had prepared and thought each other would enjoy. We shared our faith and encouraged one another through that year of life. And yes...we shared recipes!

Well, we have moved again...this time to our own home in Mineral Springs! We recently had these new, good friends over for dinner and Barbara brought Broccoli Apple Salad to add to the table. We all enjoyed it immensely and I want to share the recipe with you this month. It's a slightly different twist on the traditional broccoli salad and I think that you will find it to be cool and refreshing during this hot, humid month. Good friends are good to have. But when those good friends have good recipes to share...even better!!! Enjoy!!!

#### Broccoli Apple Salad

4 cups fresh broccoli florets, about 2 medium heads
½ cup shredded carrots
¼ cup diced red onion
2 large apples, finely chopped (The Gala variety is good.)
½ cup pecans, coarsely chopped
½ cup dried cranberries

#### Dressing:

½ cup mayonnaise
½ cup plain Greek yogurt
2 Tbsp. lemon juice
1 Tbsp. sugar
¼ tsp. salt
Pepper to taste



In a large bowl combine broccoli, carrots, red onion, apples, pecans, and dried cranberries. Whisk together the mayonnaise, Greek yogurt, lemon juice, sugar, salt and pepper. Add the dressing to the salad and toss to coat. Chill until ready to serve. Store, refrigerated, in an airtight container. Yummy!


# **Recommended Reading**



Okay...One more summer read that can be enjoyed from the comfort of your own couch (in the air conditioning!) or while sitting by the pool, the lake, or the ocean. In other words, we are recommending one more summer read for the season! It's a sweet story with lots of twists and turns that is easy to read and hard to put down.

<u>Crossing Oceans</u>, by Gina Holmes, is a selection of Christian fiction that we think most would find interesting, entertaining, and inspirational. Jenny Lucas, the central character of the book, vowed

over five years ago, that she would never return home. But, when facing a new reality and a daunting path for her future, things have a way of changing. Jenny and her five-year-old daughter, Isabella, find it necessary to return to Jenny's sleepy North Carolina hometown to face the ghosts that she thought she had left behind. Those from her past welcome Jenny and Isabella in some expected, and in some surprising ways. She receives a warm welcome from her oxygen tank-toting grandmother (a character that you will truly come to love!). She receives exactly what she expects from her stoic and distant father. And David, Isabella's dad, who doesn't even know he has a daughter, swings from cold and uninterested, to angry and bitter, to comforting and compassionate, and back again. As Jenny navigates the rough and unknown waters of relationships and tough decisions, the unforgettable story that unfolds is a testament to the power of love. Through the story we see how love can change everything, can heal old hurts, bring new beginnings, and even overcome the impossible.



As you invest in <u>Crossing Oceans</u>, you have it affirmed to you that love does find a way to heal scarred hearts, deal with tragedy, and provide second chances. Jenny finds in returning home, as we all would, that she must confront strained relationships from her past, while also trying to come to grips with an uncertain future. We think that in your reading you will find quirky, relatable, and realistic characters. You will find struggles that are gripping and that keep you turning pages. And although you will find many instances of Jenny leaning on her faith throughout her journey, there is nothing packaged or predictable about the story.

Spoiler Alert: This could be seen as a sad tale...but it is a sad tale with HOPE! <u>Crossing Oceans</u> has a strong emotional hook and will keep you reading until you wipe your eyes, blow your nose, and find your place again. It will make you think, make you laugh, and probably make you cry. But you really do need to see it through to the end for a resolution that is both realistic and inspiring. This is a work of Christian fiction that you will be glad you spent time reading! 
what's needed to ensure the future and effectiveness of Pleasant Grove right here in Oakdale and beyond.
