Inspiration Point

Paul wrote the following to the church in Ephesus. He is in prison locked up in chains as he writes this to exhort the church there!

Ephesians 3:8 – 21. This is my life work: helping people understand and respond to this Message. It came as a sheer gift to me, a real surprise. God handling all the details. When it came to presenting the Message to people who had no background in God's way, I was the least qualified of any of the available Christians. God saw to it that I was equipped but you can be sure that it had nothing to do with my natural abilities.

And so here I am, preaching and writing about things that are way over my head, the inexhaustible riches and generosity of Christ. My task is to bring out in the open and make plain what God who created all this in the first place, has been doing in secret and behind the scenes all along. Through Christians like yourselves gathered in churches, this extraordinary plan of God is becoming known and talked about even among the angels!

All this is proceeding along lines planned all along by God and then executed in Christ Jesus. When we trust in him, we're free to say whatever needs to be said; bold to go wherever we need to go. So don't let my present trouble on your behalf get you down. Be proud!

My response is to get down on my knees before the Father, this magnificent Father who parcels out all heaven and earth. I ask him to strengthen you by his Spirit—not a brute strength but a glorious inner strength—which Christ will live in you as you open the door and invite him in.

And I ask him that with both feet planted firmly on love, you'll be able to take in with all Christians the extravagant dimensions of Christ's love. Reach out and experience the breadth! Test its length! Plumb the depths! Rise to the heights! Live full lives, full in the fullness of God.

God can do anything, you know—far more than you could ever imagine or guess or request in your wildest dreams! He does it not by pushing us around but by working within us, his Spirit deeply and gently within us.

Glory to God in the church!

Glory to God in the Messiah, in Jesus!

Glory down all the generations!

Glory through all millennia! Oh, yes!

I want you to take note that Paul is not feeling sorry for himself, and he is not complaining about his circumstances! His mind is on just one thing! He is encouraging the Christians in that church! Paul has long since dedicated himself to be a servant of the Lord Jesus Christ, and because of his decision, God has gifted him to be able to tolerate whatever circumstances that comes his way as he carries out his duties as he sees them!

Currently, I am teaching a course on the Holy Spirit. As I study, I have learned that when Adam sinned so long ago, the Spirit in him died when he was disobedient to God's instructions. From that time forward, man only had his soul and his fleshly body to go on. Without a spirit, man had no godly influence to guide him. But when man accepts Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior, the Spirit of God comes into him, and man becomes acutely aware of God and His ways! As we walk with God and grow in Him, the Spirit of God gains more and more influence on the way we think, act and talk! Paul, by this time is a fully mature Christian and we can see by what he does and says that the Holy Spirit has major influence on Paul. Jesus told us that if we love God, we will be obedient unto Him! There is no question that Paul loves God because he is sacrificially obedient to God's directions to him!

At some point in our Christian walk with God, He will test us to determine whether we have truly made Him the Lord of our lives! That is the point that we will have to die to self and be prepared to give up everything that we hold on to as security! Can we truly trust God, or are we going to continue to live as carnal Christians for the rest of our lives? Does our obedience to His Word truly reflect our love for Him?

DRIVING WITHOUT DIRECTIONS

PSALM 32:8



Several years ago I went to Dallas, Texas, for a pastor's conference. I got off the plane, got into my rental car, and began driving around a city I thought I knew. I told myself, *"It may have been 1983 since I lived here, but having been a business courier in the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex area, I know these roads. I have a pretty good sense of direction, and I drove these streets for a living. I'll find my way to my hotel."*

So I felt pretty good about where I was going. After a few blocks of turning this way and that, seeing none of the places I expected to see, I was thinking I might be lost. Another 15 minutes and I was sure.

I called my hotel and explained my predicament to the hotel clerk. He asked where I was and I confessed that I had no idea, but assured him that eventually I would find my way out. He said, *"Too bad you didn't think to rent a car with GPS."* This story is from a time before our cell phones had a GPS app on them.

It was one of those 'duh' moments. My car did come with a portable GPS unit, but it was still in the glove compartment. I hadn't even thought of it. I pulled over, plugged it in, entered the address I was looking for, and within a minute a friendly voice in the little box was directing me to the right place. I actually doubted the directions a couple of times, but it turns out that the GPS knew the way better than I. Eventually I heard the words, "Arriving at destination on left..."

It reminds me of what we so often do. We think we know how to get where we want to go, but we get lost with our own dumb decisions. Then we get even more lost with even dumber decisions. All the time we have a place we can go for directions, but for some reason we neglect to look.

The Lord says, "I will guide you along the best pathway for your life. I will advise you and watch over you." (Psalm 32:8)

God has promised to guide us step by step on this journey, through our relationships and through our careers and through our finances and through our personal lives. He speaks to us through his Word and through the wisdom of spiritual leaders. Too often we neglect to listen, preferring to keep making wrong turns instead.

If you're feeling a little lost in some areas of life, and the turns you take keep leading you where you don't want to be, stop for a moment today and open your heart to his voice. Let his Word direct you to the next step you need to take. He will guide you along the best pathway for your life. I hope to see you at Pleasant Grove Methodist Church!

Disciples Class 2019 Port-A-Pit Barbeque



The Disciples Sunday School Class wishes to thank all of the dedicated volunteers, and especially the customers, who participated in our Port-A-Pit BBQ Chicken fundraiser. This was once again an example of dedicated Christian fellowship that leads to a very successful fundraiser, in addition to good fun for all involved.

This year marked the 10th year of holding this event and was by far the biggest yet! We had ordered 1100 plates, but actually sold 1220. That number includes 665 plates that were delivered to local businesses that continue to be faithful customers year after year. The timely delivery of those plates is a tremendous effort and requires another level of organization altogether. All of these sales reports exceeded all other year's sales records. And it could not have been accomplished without our faithful workers, and of course, those who purchased dinners from us. This year we had participation from 27 of our class members and even 5 non-members. Another factor that contributed to the success of this event was our dedicating the whole event as a joint memorial to Ed Sing, our faithful organizer, and Sonny Watkins, one of our hard workers each year. These two men served each year with love and dedication, were brothers-in-law, and passed away one month before this year's event.

We can slap ourselves on the back all we like, but the real success of the event, and our eternal gratitude, goes to the Lord God Almighty who blessed every single activity of the event. The profits from this fundraiser allow us to support many church financial needs such as non-budgeted maintenance items as well as serving some emergency needs of individuals, both financial and otherwise. We have been able to contribute generously to The Lord's Fund, the new roof on the church office building, the replacement of a hot water heater for the children's building, and the restoration of our church steeple. We have also been able to assist a flooded Methodist Church in Lumberton, NC. This year we were able to help supplement the costs associated with the church's annual Homecoming celebration and the Cockman Family Concert too.

The Disciples Class sincerely appreciates the continued support of the congregation in helping make this event a success for the benefit of the entire church family!!!

A New Way to Serve at Pleasant Grove



For quite a few years now, our sweet church has participated in Operation Christmas Child...collecting gift-filled shoe boxes to be sent to children around the world. And we usually do pretty good! Our collection numbers fall somewhere between 180-275 boxes. That's fantastic! Just think of all of the smiles and giggles that happen all because someone cares. Just think of the hearts and lives that are changed because they get to know of God's love and the Gospel message! With this spirit rising among the people of our church we will soon see our boxes begin to come in and add up again.

But, do you ever feel like God is calling us to something more? Of course, we have all felt that warm tug on our hearts. Many times, though, we just can't quite glean what God has in mind for us. Pastor Byron and Sherri Brown have kicked this subject around for the better part of a year now and they have come up with a new mission opportunity for each and every one of us.

On Sunday, November 10th, during the Sunday school time slot, you are invited to an Operation Christmas Child Packing Party. (We are giving all of our wonderful Sunday school teachers the day off!) We will meet in the fellowship hall just after the 9:00 worship service. During this one hour of service we are going to attempt to fill 200 shoe boxes!!! You read that right! These boxes will be above and beyond the boxes that you, your family, your Sunday school class, your school group, or your benevolence group packs and turns in to the church. So, if you do the math and we rely on our history of giving, it is quite possible that we just might collect over 400 shoe boxes this year! Can you imagine?

So, on Sunday, November 10th, the boxes will be there. The items to go in the boxes will be there. The labels will be there. This is all coming together using a combination of mission budget money and individual donations. Items are being ordered in bulk to be sure that we get the best price possible. (We don't want to leave anyone out of this process...if you would like to contribute financially to this project you may turn in a check to the church office or to the offering plate. Just mark a check "shoe boxes." Remember though, that this is above and beyond what you normally do.) You are welcome to bring any extra items you would like to contribute but that isn't necessary. All we really need is you! This is going to be great fun!! Make plans now to join in on this effort with your church family. Help us make a bigger difference in the world for Christ!

Hi! My name is Sherri Brown. Most of you know me and if you have spent any time around me over the last couple of weeks, you probably wish I would stop talking about this book! But, I am just so taken with The Church of the Small Things and I want all the ladies of Pleasant Grove to read it!

I am taking the liberty of recommending this book for the month of October. The Church of the Small Things, by Melanie Shankle, is just such a sweet read. It is definitely written to an audience of women and I think all women will relate to the stories within. However, I have read parts of it

aloud to my husband, Scott, and we have both laughed out loud at the humor found in its pages. At times, I couldn't keep reading because of the laughter-tears in my eyes!

This book takes the reader on a journey through Melanie's life...growing up influenced by grandparents, living through her parents' divorce, finding fast, true friends in college, marrying the love of her life and parenting her daughter, Caroline. While telling her story she is very honest and open about all sorts of womanly things... so don't be shocked at some of what she feels free to share! Woven throughout these benchmark occasions in life, though, Melanie points to the million little pieces that truly make up a life. She remembers sweating on her grandparents' Naugahyde couch, weekends at the lake, teenage crushes, the mistake of buying a white couch, the struggle to exercise, becoming a soccer family, growing up with a sister and having a husband who decides he wants to hunt wild boar from a helicopter! Her life has been so full of love, laughter, comic relief...but also frustration, insecurity, questions, and loss. Melanie never forgets the foundation of it all though...Christ who lives in each of us and in everything around us.

Melanie knows that God uses the smallest acts of faithfulness to love and influence the people around us – sometimes that is simply packing sandwiches for lunch or working in a cubicle or playing tea party one more time even though you feel like gnawing your arm off! She knows what it's like to get so caught up in wanting something to take our breath away that we lose our amazement at every breath we take. In this book, Melanie invites us all to see our daily tasks as the holy and precious callings that they are. As we see how real life meets eternity every single day, we can let go of the pressure to experience big moments (like the ones constantly on display on social media) and delight in the small ones instead.

As I read this book, I laughed (out loud), giggled, pondered, and yes, even cried, and I certainly did a lot of thinking and rethinking this crazy thing that we call life and how we should be doing it as individuals and as the family of humanity. If there was any doubt in your mind, let me be clear; I highly recommend The Church of the Small Things by Melanie Shankle! I hope you enjoy it as much as I did!!!

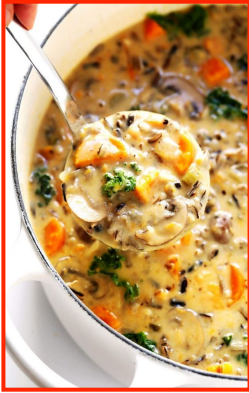
Homecoming and Revival 2019

The Recipe Box



Well Church, it is October...the unofficial start to SOUP season! For those days when you are just craving a cozy, creamy, comforting bowl of soup...have we got a recipe for you! This recipe comes from www.gimmesomeoven.com and there are many variations on this recipe if you would like to explore them on the website. There are options for the slow cooker and the instant pot. There are gluten-free and vegan options. There are other veggies suggested, along with directions for adding chicken to the basic recipe. Options, variations and choices are always good to have in your back pocket when it comes to cooking. Whichever method and whatever ingredients you decide on using, you basically have the most delicious, hearty, sweet-and-savory, thick and creamy, comforting soup you could ask for! So, if you are ready to cozy up with a warm bowl of soup, we give you Cozy Autumn Wild Rice Soup.

Cozy Autumn Wild Rice Soup

(makes 8 servings)

6 cups vegetable stock (or chicken stock)
 1 cup uncooked 100% wild rice
 8 ounces Baby Bella mushrooms, sliced
 4 cloves garlic, minced
 2 medium carrots, diced
 2 ribs celery, diced
 1 large (about one pound) sweet potato, peeled and diced
 1 small white onion, peeled and diced
 1 bay leaf
 1 ½ tablespoon Old Bay Seasoning (substitute Italian seasoning or Cajun seasoning, if you prefer)
 4 tablespoons butter
 ¼ cup all purpose flour
 1 ½ cups milk
 2 large handfuls of kale, roughly chopped with thick stems removed
 Kosher salt and freshly cracked black pepper to taste

1. Heat one tablespoon of butter in a large stockpot over medium high heat. Add onion and sauté for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally, until soft and translucent. Stir in the garlic and cook for an additional 1-2 minutes, stirring occasionally, until fragrant.
2. Add in the vegetable stock, wild rice, mushrooms, carrots, celery, sweet potato, bay leaf and Old Bay seasoning (or seasoning of your choice). Stir to combine.
3. Continue cooking until the soup reaches a simmer. Then reduce heat to medium low, cover and simmer for 45 minutes, or until the rice is tender, stirring occasionally.
4. Meanwhile, during those final 10 minutes, prepare your cream sauce in a separate saucepan on the stove. In it, cook 3 tablespoons of butter over medium high heat until melted. Whisk in the flour until combined, and cook for one minute. Gradually add in the milk, and whisk until combined. Continue cooking, stirring frequently, until the mixture *nearly* comes to a simmer and has thickened. It should be very thick.
5. Add the cream sauce and kale to the soup, and stir gently until combined. Taste and season with salt and pepper.
6. Serve warm, with crusty, toasted bread. You can also transfer to a sealed container and refrigerate for up to 4 days.



Backpack Buddies Enters Its Tenth Year!!!



We are off and running with our tenth year in ministry through the Backpack Buddies program. Through this effort we supply weekend food for up to 20 students at Oakdale Elementary School. These students have been identified as having a food insecure situation in their homes and this weekend food helps to bridge the family from Friday to

Monday. This ministry operates completely on donations, both monetary donations and donations of specific food items. Many of our church members sponsor an item each month and supply the anticipated need on a regular basis. However, not all of our items are currently sponsored. There is always a need for the following items: canned beef stew, canned chili beans, vegetable beef soup, canned spaghetti, beefaroni or ravioli, chicken salad kits, and tuna salad kits. It would be great if we would all just make a note of this list and have it with us when we are at the grocery store. If each of us only picked up one of these items each time we went grocery shopping, the monthly need would most likely be met!!! (You know how many church members you run into at the store each week, right!!!) The Backpack Buddies Ministry team thanks you in advance for making this, our tenth year in mission, all the more successful!!!
